The WHO World **Malaria Report estimated** that over 1 billion cases of "fever suspected of being malaria" occur every year globally. Rapid and timely diagnosis at home and in point-of-need settings is critical for effective management of malaria. Most malaria deaths occur within 48 hours of fever. Current national and global efforts, including WHO and African Heads of State, mandate diagnosis prior to treatment in all cases of fever at home or in point-of-need settings to facilitate effective treatment within 24 hours. The **Urine Malaria Test (UMT) offers a unique and critically** needed tool that will remove the guesswork currently used in the clinical management of malaria. It is the only non-invasive one-step test that tells in 25 minutes if a fever is due to malaria or not.

alaria is endemic in most parts of the world, including sub-Saharan Africa, Mideast, South America, Asia and the Pacific. In fact, 4 of 5 BRICS countries – Brazil, India, China and South Africa – are endemic for malaria. The critical challenge used to be the lack of a simple, non-invasive diagnostic test that could be performed by non-technical persons in point-of-need or at home settings to facilitate early diagnosis and prompt targeted treatment. However, the Urine Malaria Test (UMT) created by Fyodor meets this challenge.

Malaria is an infectious disease caused by the parasite Plasmodium. In Nigeria, about 98% of the malaria cases are caused by this parasite. It is estimated that Nigeria loses about 132 billion Naira annually to malaria due to absenteeism from work, school, and farm, as well as during time of relations' deaths. Malaria has severe negative effects on maternal health, as it causes maternal anemia, miscarriage, and low birth weight.


